ABOUT THE EDITH BAKER ART SCHOLARSHIP

To celebrate its 20th anniversary in 2005, DADA created a scholarship honoring a respected member of the Dallas art community and one of its founding members, Edith Baker. Edith owned and directed The Edith Baker Gallery in Dallas for nearly 30 years before retiring in 2004. Proceeds from several DADA events held each year will continue to benefit the Edith Baker Art Scholarship Fund. The scholarship will annually benefit a graduating senior from Booker T. Washington High School for the Performing and Visual Arts who is planning to attend college and continue his or her studies in the visual arts. The amount of the scholarship is \$3,000. Besides the cash donation, the finalists and the winner may display works at the Spring Gallery Walk through an exhibition at a member gallery (Norwood Flynn). The winner also receives a summer internship and a mentor-for-a-day program with an art space director of the winner's choice.
